David Perdue wants to stop us from achieving a clean energy future.

Perdue lives in a gated island community that has built a sea wall to protect his 9,000 square-foot mansion from sea level rise. Meanwhile, he denies that humans are causing it and refuses to take steps to fight sea level rise for the rest of us who live in coastal Georgia.

- When it comes to his own house and his own investments, Perdue clearly cares about the impacts of climate change, but he'll sell the rest of us out to fossil fuel interests.
- He <u>voted against</u> a "Senate" resolution that would have affirmed the science proving that climate change is real and caused by people.
- When asked whether climate change is caused by humans, Perdue made as if he doesn't understand science and claimed that, "Nobody really knows that."

If David Perdue has his way, Georgia will be left behind as the rest of the country transitions to clean energy, just like West Virginia was when the rest of the country transitioned away from coal.

- Perdue <u>co-sponsored legislation to roll back the EPA's Clean Power Plan</u>. He called EPA's Clean Power Plan "shortsighted."
- He <u>opposes</u> renewable energy and voted <u>against energy efficiency</u>, and <u>repeatedly</u> voted <u>against funding for clean energy</u>. He also voted <u>against clean energy tax credits</u>.
- Perdue and 21 other Senators <u>wrote a letter</u> to Trump, writing, "We urge you to make a clean exit from the Paris Agreement so that your Administration can follow through on its commitment to rescind the Clean Power Plan."

Perdue has cut dozens of laws protecting clean air and water for Georgians. He prioritizes the profits of oil, gas, and coal companies who have donated over \$470,000 to his campaign, over the health and wellbeing of Georgians.

- He voted to block local public input on use of public lands
- He voted to exempt power plants that burn coal waste from safe air and water standards.
- He voted to to allow <u>fracking companies to ignore clean water regulations</u>
- He voted for billion dollars worth of taxpayer handouts to the fossil fuel industry
- He voted to <u>allow dangerous methane pollution</u> released by the oil and gas industry on public lands.
- He voted to allow public lands to be sold off to oil and gas companies

He supports expanded oil drilling in dangerous places, including offshore.

- He voted to incentivize dangerous offshore drilling.
- He voted to pave the way for <u>drilling</u> in publicly-owned protected wilderness areas of Alaska.
- He voted to expedite drilling on public lands.
